Welcome to the Ark Preschool!


The purpose of the Ark is to provide a Christian environment in which preschool children can learn and grow. Parents are the most important teachers of their children and the Ark's goal is to supplement the training and teaching of the home. Children will learn in a safe, positive, encouraging atmosphere to work independently and in group structured situations. Their learning experiences will help them to make the transition to a more formal school setting.

The Ark is licensed by the State of Kansas and provides educational, social and spiritual learning experiences in a Christian setting for the preschool age child. To be enrolled, children should be between the ages of 3 and 5 years, potty-trained, have a physical examination, and the required immunizations before attending preschool.

Program

The Ark Preschool offers a half day program to provide a comprehensive and coordinated plan of activities to help a child develop socially, emotionally, and intellectually, as well developing skills such as listening, following directions, self-expression, creativity, and fine and gross motor skills.

The curriculum includes topics such holidays, weather, seasons, nutrition, homes and family, friends, animals, plants, our community, and many more. The lessons integrate language, math, art, music, science, and social studies learning experiences appropriate for the preschool age level.

Spiritual Learning

The spiritual training includes Bible stories, songs, Bible verses, and prayer times. A Christian perspective is incorporated into all areas of the curriculum. The basic ageappropriate objectives of the spiritual training of children ages 3 to 5 are "God made me", "God loves me", "God made the world", and "Jesus is God's Son".

Daily Routines

Our schedule is planned to provide a balance of active and quiet activities in small group and large group settings. Children work individually to encourage independence and confidence, and with a group to develop social skills such as cooperation, taking turns, sharing, kindness, and understanding. Daily activities include a Bible lesson, art activities, group circle time, snack time, large group and small group instruction times, stories, music and movement, and games for small and large muscle development.
